

## Christmas concert at St Edward : King and Martyr

The parish church of Castle Donington is dedicated to Saint Edward: King and Martyr. The Domesday Book makes mention of a priest at Castle Donington in 1086 and the present church dates from circa 1200. It is therefore somewhat remiss that it has taken over 800 years for the choir to undertake its first performance in the church on Friday 20th December. The Reverend Andrew Pace was a perfect host and the appreciative audience enjoyed a mix of Christmas songs and carols. The programme of songs included a piano duet with Anne and Louise playing Jingle Bells. Tenor, Kevin Griffiths sang an Alfred Burt composition entitled "Some children see him" and an octet from within the choir delivered a rendition of "O Holy Night". The evening was brought to a close with a joyous rendition of "O come all ye faithful" with ladies within the audience providing a wonderful descant. Proceeds from the evening will be shared between the choir's charity Doorways Derby and the fund to replace the church roof.





# CATHEDRAL OUARTER DERBY

The lunchtime of Saturday 21st December found the choir fulfilling their final commitment for 2019. Ten members sang carols on behalf of the Cathedral Quarter BID team and also undertook a session of singing adjacent to St. Peter's Church. Once again the weather was relatively mild for the time of year and a number of choristers discarded their woolly hats for this session. Combing the fee and collection the event raised just under £300 which is considerably more than many of our concerts so far this year. This number of commitments was a very challenging project for a relatively small choir such as ours and it needed people who were prepared to go that extra mile - thankfully we have a number of choristers who match up to that . So when all the mutual backslapping and bonhomie settles down I would ask that we show our gratitude to those choristers who made this Christmas so successful for our charity fundraising.

Both Len St John and Tony Davenport managed to attend all

twelve events - a fantastic achievement.

There is another group who were not far behind Tony and Len; attending 11 out of the 12 events. This group included Dave Carver, Malcolm Richardson, Eric Singleton, Ken Barnes and Clive Titcombe. Others also chipped in and managed to attend the majority of events despite work, family, social and other commitments - yes we are all very busy at his time of year!!

It should not go unnoticed that these 12 events are likely to contribute about half of the target figure we would like to raise for our charity this year. Within this figure of approximately £2500; only £350 has been generated by formal concerts - those at Asterdale Primary and Castle Donington church. So whilst the formal concert may be enjoyable and provide the opportunity for solos and four part harmony, if we are serious about raising money for charity we need to be prepared to take advantage of the more mundane commercial opportunities available to us prior to Christmas.
